Drama. Theater. Stage. Lights. Action. West Lutheran's Theater Department showed its versatility in the 2024–2025 school year with three unique and engaging productions. The fall drama, Deadline - A Murder Mystery Comedy by Don Zolidis, directed by David Denninger, brought classic mystery tropes to life: a remote mansion, guirky staff, unsuspecting guests, and a sudden murder that had to be solved. With bold comedic characters and laugh-out-loud moments, the show kept audiences entertained and guessing until the final curtain.

This year's West traveling show was La Bella Cinderella by Claudia Haas, a prolific local playwright from White Bear Lake. This whimsical, Italian-inspired twist on the classic Cinderella tale delighted audiences with humor, heart, and all the pasta jokes you could imagine! Our talented dual casts brought the show to audiences at seven of our area Lutheran grade schools.

Our spring musical, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat by Andrew Lloyd Webber, was a vibrant and memorable production. Twenty-two West Lutheran students were joined by 23 children from our member congregations, creating a dynamic and heartwarming cast. The show's popularity was evident - selling a record-breaking 1,200 tickets, making it the most attended theater production in West history.

ATHLETICS WARRIOR SPIRIT.

BASEBALL The West Lutheran baseball had an exciting season, with over 30 student-athletes across two teams. The varsity team finished 5–11, with many close games, including a late-season upset over top-ranked St. Agnes. Sophomore Carter Anderson earned 2nd Team All-Conference honors, while Ethan Fehrenkamp received Honorable Mention and made the Section 5AA Tournament Team. The JV team ended with a 4–10 record.

LACROSSE The Providence Academy boys varsity lacrosse team (in co-op with West Lutheran) finished the 2025 season with a 7–8 record and placed third in the Independent Metro Athletic Conference (2–2). Highlights included a 10–9 comeback over Breck, an 11–7 win against Becker, and a 16–3 rout of Academy of Holy Angels. Junior Minkee Schempp (#24) led a defense that notched a .569 save percentage and 396 ground balls. Offensively, the Lions tallied 136 goals and 79 assists.

TRAP The 2025 WLHS Trap Team had a strong spring season with 20 shooters, including several new members. The co-ed team included 3 girls and 17 boys. Many athletes posted high scores throughout the season, with Conor Asleson shooting a perfect 25. Firearms safety remained a priority at every practice. Special thanks to our supportive parents and coaches Eric Reynolds, Lorelle Neu, and Greg Schempp.

BOYS SOCCER The Warriors made it into sections this year pushing an already amazing season into a great post season. The Senior class of 9 boys made a lasting impression on the West soccer program. Gabe Meist made the all-state team. Karsten Kromschroeder, Tommy Ellis, Clayton Ernst and Leo Roeber made all-conference.

GIRLS SOCCER JV and Varsity Girls Soccer had a great season! While co-oping with Maranatha Christian Academy, their record improved. The Varsity Girls had an overall of 5-6-6 and the JV girls had an overall of 7-0-1. Our senior Sophia Beck received All Conference and Defensive MVP. After a 10 year hiatus, this coming season West will have enough players to start their own Warrior Girls Soccer team.

FOOTBALL The Providence Lions co-op football team had a strong season at both levels. Varsity finished 6–2, just one game shy of the 4A state tournament. The C-team also went 6–2, highlighted by a comeback win over rival Orono, sealed with a goal-line stand. Standout performances included sophomores Hayden Kiecker (2 interceptions) and Carl Meitner.

VOLLEYBALL The Girls Varsity Volleyball team wrapped up an impressive season with a strong playoff run, advancing all the way to the section final. In a historic moment, they captured their *first-ever* set victory in a section championship match. A standout highlight from the season was senior captain McKenzie Burke becoming West Lutheran's all-time leader in kills, finishing her high school career with an incredible 876 kills. The team is excited for the next chapter and eager to build on this year's success. **BOYS CROSS COUNTRY** Continuing their tradition of success, the West Lutheran boys *won* the MCAA conference meet for the 8th straight year, the section meet for the 3rd, and placed 5th at state. Seniors Jacob Pfotenhauer and Isaiah Boerner were key contributors - Jacob took 2nd in the conference (16:01, second all-time) and at the 4A section meet. This team supports each other in running and in life, with their sights set on a state title next year.

GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY For the *first time* in program history, the West Lutheran girls made a team appearance at state, finishing 8th of 16 teams. They also won the MCAA conference for the second year in a row and claimed their first-ever section title. Senior Grace Hahm led the way, covering the 5K course in an impressive time of 19:13. The team has set a new standard and is excited for next season.

TRACK AND FIELD West Lutheran Track and Field had a historic 2025 season, *breaking* 17 school records - including the boys and girls 4x400 and 4x800, boys long jump, and discus. The boys team won their *first-ever* conference championship, and West Lutheran set a new record with 6 boys and 1 girl qualifying for state. At the state meet, the boys 4x800 placed 9th, and senior Gabe Miest took 8th in the 200m. All glory to God.

HOCKEY Five West Lutheran boys played this 2024-2025 hockey season under the Providence Academy Lions Boy's Hockey Coop, which includes West Lutheran High School, Heritage Christian Academy, Legacy Christian Academy, and PACT Charter School. The boy's hockey program advanced to the semi-final round of the metro Section 2A of the MSHSL and finished the season 12-12-3.

SOFTBALL The Warrior Softball team finished their season 14-8 and with a 2nd place finish in MCAA conference. The lady Warriors were led by team captains Eleanor Rolf and Marissa Tusler to their 4th straight section final game. Kailey Oppitz led the post season at the plate with a .536 batting average and .950 slugging percentage. To add to the season accolades, MCAA All Conference was awarded to Eleanor Rolf, Marissa Tusler, Kailey Oppitz, and Juliet Roeber. With the 2nd place Section final finish, we were awarded 5 All-Section to Eleanor Rolf, Marissa Tusler, Kailey Oppitz, Emme Roeber, and Grace Rolf.

BOYS BASKETBALL The 2024-25 boys basketball team took on one of the toughest schedules in team history with games against much larger schools in their non-conference games. Although their record wasn't as good as hoped, the team kept improving throughout the season. This was shown with them winning 5 of their last 7 games and winning their first 2 games in the playoffs.

GIRLS BASKETBALL The Girls Varsity Basketball team finished 3rd in the MCAA South Division with a 20-8 overall record. The team made it to the quarterfinal round of section tournament play. During the season, team captain, Marissa Tusler reached the 1,000 point milestone and became the West Lutheran Girls basketball all time leading scorer. Freshmen, Veda Makepeace ended the season 9th in the state for made 3-pointers with 96 on the year.

BOWLING Varsity and JV bowling had an impressive season showing great skill and teamwork on the lanes. Both teams consistently brought energy and determination to every match. We're looking forward to building on that momentum next season.
