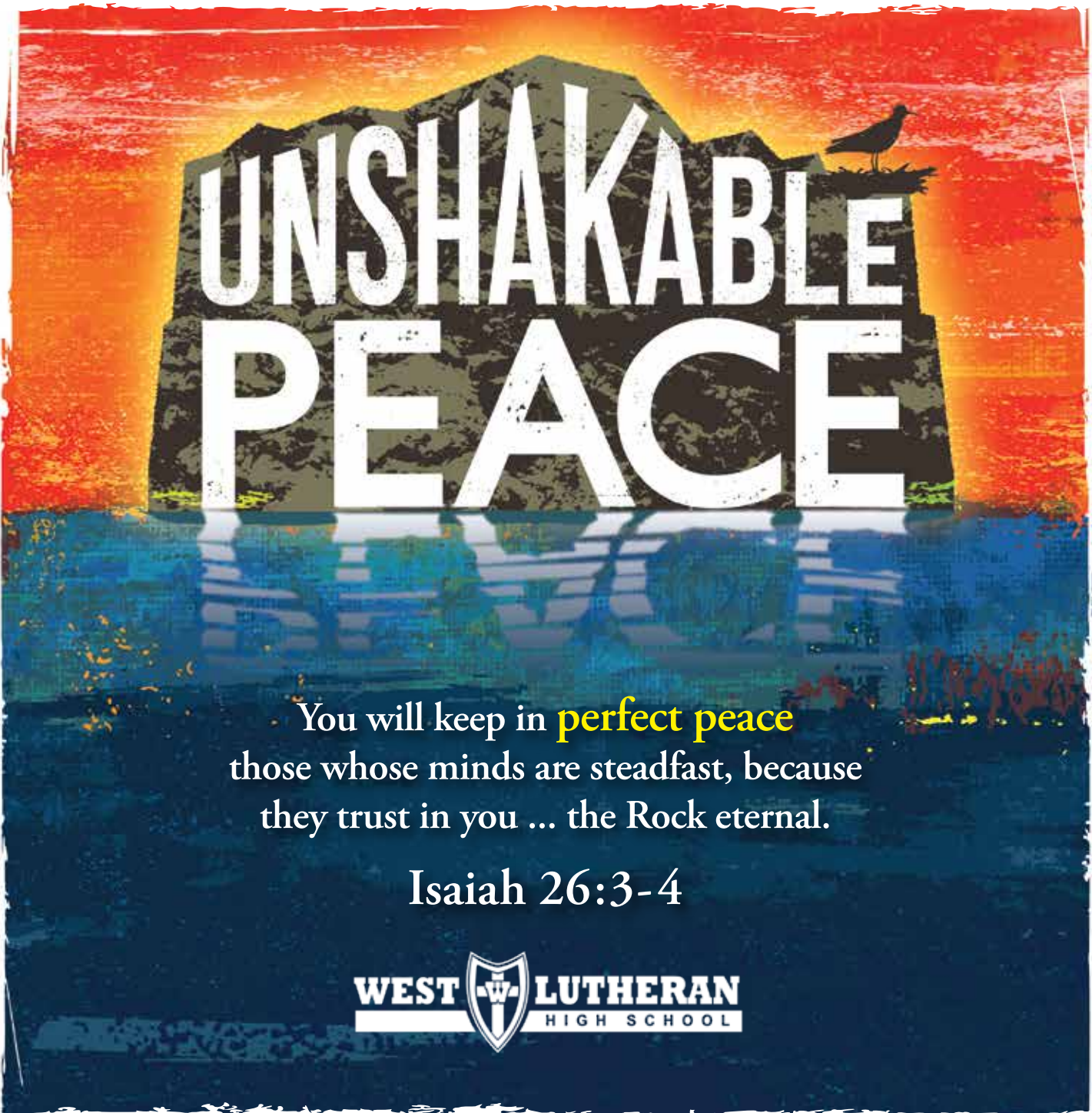

PRINCIPAL'S LETTER THE YEAR IN REVIEW

"You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you. Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord, the Lord himself, is the Rock eternal." Isaiah 26:3-4 (NIV)

As we reflect on the 2025-2026 school year, we are once again reminded through Isaiah of God's abundant blessings and faithfulness to the ministry of West Lutheran High School. Throughout the year, we witnessed the Rock Eternal's hand at work, in our classrooms, activities, athletics, fine arts programs and mission opportunities.

West Lutheran finished the school year with 205 students and celebrated the graduation of 52 seniors. These young men and women leave West equipped with a Christ-centered education and prepared to serve God and share His love in their future vocations. We remain grateful for the opportunity to partner with families in helping students grow academically, spiritually, and personally.

Our students continued to excel across academics, arts, athletics and activities. Highlights included the Fine Arts department's production of *Newsies*, hosting a regional Bandfest and a successful Spring Showcase, along with athletic and extracurricular achievements such as state appearances in girls basketball, boys baseball, girls softball and robotics.

Perhaps most encouraging were the opportunities our students had to share their faith. This summer, 19 students and 3 faculty members formed two mission teams and traveled to Idaho and New Orleans to participate in outreach efforts, boldly sharing the message of Jesus Christ. These experiences reflect the heart of our mission and the impact of Christian education beyond the walls of West Lutheran.

We are also thankful for the continued generosity of our supporters. The annual "The Future Is Bright" Gala raised more than \$216,000 to support tuition assistance and campus improvement projects, while our Give to the Max campaign raised almost \$70,000 for a new grand piano that is already enriching our music program. In addition, West received a wonderful gift through our growing partnership with Stratasys 3-D Printing, which is highlighted in this magazine.

As we look ahead, we do so with confidence in God's promises and gratitude for your prayers, encouragement and support. Thank you for helping make West Lutheran a place where students continue to Learn, Believe, Grow and Achieve to God's glory.

3-D PRINTING

STRATASYS

Over the past four years, engineering students and robotics team members have toured Stratasys facilities and utilized its support to produce student-designed robotics parts. This spring, Stratasys donated an industrial-sized 3D printer, materials, a wash tank and training to West Lutheran. Beginning in the 2026-2027 school year, students in engineering and robotics will use this technology to expand their learning and creativity. 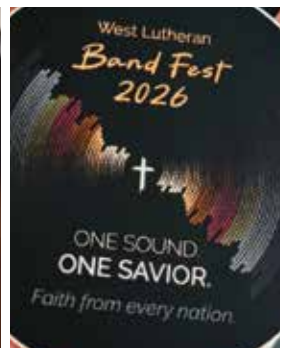


FINE ARTS

This production introduced some of Shakespeare's most famous characters including Petruchio and Katherine from *The Taming of the Shrew*, the Witches of *Macbeth*, Puck from *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, and the gentle Juliet asking "wherefore art thou, Romeo?" Our young audiences delighted in the broad, outrageous comedy while being gently introduced to The Bard.

ATHLETICS

WARRIOR NATION

BASEBALL The Warriors baseball team finished an outstanding season with a conference championship, a 20-5 record and an appearance in the section final after earning the #1 seed. Seniors Jack Larson and Magnus Nelson provided strong leadership throughout the season. First Team All-Conference honors went to Carter Anderson, Spencer Bostic, Ethan Day, Mitch Grant and Charles Kleist. First Team All-Section honors were earned by Ethan Day, Ethan Fehrenkamp, Preston Rouen and Jack Larson. Ethan Day received an All-State nomination after recording 101 strikeouts in 48 innings, while Jack Larson was nominated for Academic All-State. Awesome season, Warriors! -Coach Gurgel

VOLLEYBALL The West Lutheran varsity volleyball team finished the season 11-21 overall and 5-4 in conference play. Season highlights included a Dig Pink Night victory over Eagle Ridge Academy and a home playoff win against North Lakes Academy. GIRLS BASKETBALL The West Lutheran girls basketball team finished an outstanding season at 20-9, advancing to the Section 4A Championship game. Guided by resilience, teamwork and a commitment to playing for Christ, the Warriors achieved success on and off the court. Senior Marissa Tusler became West Lutheran's all-time leading scorer, surpassing 2,000 career points. Sophomore Veda Makepeace reached 1,000 career points and led the state for much of the season in three-pointers made. Both earned First Team All-Conference honors. Emme Roeber, Juliet Roeber and Georgia Roeber also earned All-Conference recognition for their contributions to the team's success. With three starters returning, the future is bright for West Lutheran girls basketball. - Coach Jensen

BOYS BASKETBALL The West Lutheran boys basketball team finished a successful season above .500 with a 14-13 record. Senior captains Micah Schroeder, Jack Larson and Brandon Knebel provided leadership and anchored the team throughout the year. Freshman Cody Oppitz led the team in scoring (14.5 PPG), while junior Bennett DeRosier led in rebounds (8.5 RPG). All-Conference honors went to Cody Oppitz (Second Team), Bennett DeRosier (Honorable Mention), Micah Schroeder (Honorable Mention) and Casey Douma (Honorable Mention). FOOTBALL The Providence Academy Lions varsity football team (Co-op) finished the season with a 2-6 record but saw vast improvement throughout the year with a host of young players. Seven West Lutheran players contributed significant varsity minutes during year and the Lions return much of their team for next season. 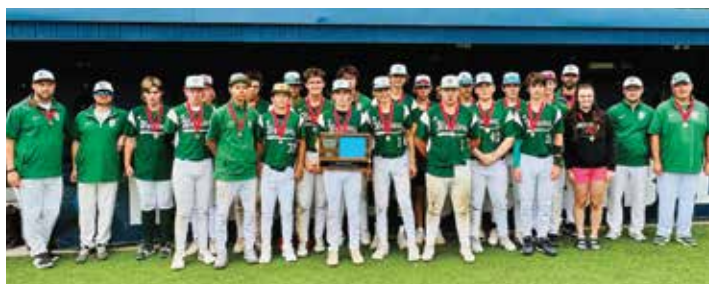

Eleanor is well deserving of her many accolades, earning All-State Tournament Team, All-Section, First Team All-Conference and Team MVP honors. Watching her develop into a dominant pitcher on the state's biggest stage, while also leading this team, has been a privilege. Senior captain Marissa Tusler also played a key role, leading the offense during the state tournament and earning All-State Tournament Team, All-Section and First Team All-Conference Honorable Mention recognition. Another captain, Kailey Optiz, anchored the infield at shortstop, recording a perfect fielding percentage throughout section and state tournament play. She will be recognized with All-Conference Second Team and All-Section honors. This season's success was truly a team effort. Additional All-Section Team honorees include Maddy Olmanson, Juliet Roeber and Grace Rolf. Emme Roeber, senior, will be receiving the Warrior Award for her incredible work ethic, perseverance in becoming a key contributor in the outfield and for consistently being an exceptional teammate. Natalie Josephitis (So., MF #15): Team leader with 15 goals, 12 assists and 59 shots on goal. Georgia Roeber (Fr., W/S #5): 9 goals, 9 assists and 42 shots on goal. Elisha Erickson (Sr., CB #20): Versatile defender who led the back line with key stops, turnovers and transition play. Every player made valuable contributions, often competing with only one substitute available. The coaches are extremely proud of this team and all they accomplished. -Coach Batista



TRACK AND FIELD The 2026 West Lutheran track and field season was one to remember -school records fell, personal records were plentiful and another state qualifier emerged. Both the boys and girls teams finished 4th at the conference meet, with individual conference champions Max Gruenhagen (3200m) and the 4x400 relay. The boys broke the 4x100 school record twice, while the girls shattered records from Trinity Zimmerman (800m), Nora Arps (300m Hurdles), Niyah Kreuter (Long Jump), Mackenzie Effertz (Triple Jump), Chloe Hahn (Discus) and the 4x200, 4x400 and 4x800 relays. The season capped off with Junior Dominick Larson qualifying for the MSHSL State Meet in the 3200m. To God be the glory! -Coach Rauh



CROSS COUNTRY Both the boys and girls teams had outstanding seasons. The varsity boys and girls each captured MCAA Conference Championships, with the JV girls also taking a conference title! At Sections, the girls earned 3rd place, qualifying two individuals including Trinity Zimmermann, while the boys placed 2nd in one of the most competitive fields in recent memory, qualifying as a team for state. On November 1st, the boys delivered again - finishing 5th in the state, marking their 4th consecutive top-5 finish!
